

BLFC 2023 – COVID-19 Policy Change

September 29th, 2023

What changed?

The wording has been changed to reflect that the most up-to-date vaccine in the US is made with a single strain (monovalent) instead of two strains (bivalent).

This update does not make the policy more restrictive nor more permissive.

If you already met the requirements prior to this revision, you will still meet the reworded requirements.

Why did the policy change?

The FDA's recommended vaccine update for the 2023-2024 season no longer is a bivalent vaccine. We are updating the policy for clarity. The reworded policy now will include both the bivalent vaccines in use in the US from Sept 1, 2022, until approx. Sept 12, 2023, and the updated monovalent vaccine being distributed after the bivalent vaccine authorization ended.
